MRS. DILLENBECK, FORT PLAIN, DIES

PALATINE BRIDGE—Mrs. Hattie Dillenbeck, 87, died Sunday evening at the Nellis Nursing Home, Palatine Bridge, following an illness of two years.

She was born Aug. 13, 1865, at Fort Plain, the daughter of Jacob and Catherine Gray Ehle.

Her husband, George Dillenbeck, died in 1903. They were former residents of Brookmans Corners.

Mrs. Dillenbeck had been a resident of Fort Plain for the last 18 years. She was a member of the Universalist Church, the Order of the Eastern Star, and the Otsquago Grange.

Surviving are three sons, James Dillenbeck, Scotia, Russell Dillenbeck and Seward Dillenbeck, Fort Plain; two grandchildren, one great grandchild and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be conducted tomorrow at 2 p.m. at the Swartz funeral home with the Rev. Lyman Achenbach, pastor of the Universalist Church of the Messiah, officiating. Interment will be in the Fort Plain Cemetery.

There is frequent confusion of the spelling for this family in newspaper records, but the name of her son Russell Dillenbeck (1893-1972) on his marker in the Fort Plain Cemetery is spelled with an "a." Also the name of her husband in his obituary from the *Evening Recorder* of Amsterdam NY on Thu. 3 Dec 1903 is spelled with an "a." I am unable to find an online image of Hattie Dillenbeck's marker.
