Was a Past Grand of Rising Crown Rebekah Lodge

Dolgeville, April 4.—A death which brings deep regret in the village is that of Mrs. Eda Delia Dingman, wife of Randolph C. Dingman, which occurred Tuesday night at her home on Elm street and was due to heart trouble, from which she had suffered for some time past. Mrs. Dingman was born in Canajoharie in 1876 and was the daughter of Henry and the late Mrs. Henry Reamon. About 25 years ago she was united in marriage to Mr. Dingman, and for many years she had lived in Dolgeville. She was a past grand of the Rising Crown Rebekah Lodge. She was a kind-hearted woman of worthiest character who was loved and esteemed by her legion of friends. Surviving, besides her husband, are her father, living in Fort Plain, and two brothers, Henry Reamon, Jr., of Fort Plain and Charles of Watertown. The funeral will be held from the Universalist church to-morrow afternoon at 2:30, and interment will be made here.
