MILO C. DODGE DIES IN FLORIDA

Had Been in Charge of Industrial Research For
Columbian Rope Co. Until He Retired Two Years Ago

Milo C. Dodge of 12 Morris Street died Monday afternoon at Gulf Port, Florida.

Mr. Dodge joined the Columbian Rope Company as a member of the sales department on June 2, 1924. He was later placed in charge of industrial research, a position he held until he retired from the company in 1947. Prior to coming to Auburn he had been employed by the Plymouth Cordage Company of North Plymouth, Mass., and by the Gates Paper Twine Company in Pleasantville, N. Y.

Mr. Dodge had been a member of the Auburn Rotary Club, the Auburn Elks, the Masons, and was a trustee of the First Universalist Church. He had spent the last few winters in Gulf Port, near St. Petersburg, Fla.

Mr. Dodge was born on October 21, 1881. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Marjory H. Dodge; a son, Richard Dodge, of Jackson, Miss.; a daughter, Mrs. Thomas C. [Eleanor] Hassett of Utica; five grandchildren, Marilyn and Richard Dodge, and Thomas, James and Stephen Hassett.

The body will be brought to Auburn. Funeral arrangements are incomplete.
