DEATH CLAIMS FORMER MAYOR

Dolgeville—Harry H. Dopp, 69, died Aug. 20, 1944 of coronary thrombosis in his home, 166 S. Main St. He had been in ill health for one and one-half years following an operation.

He was born Nov. 20, 1874 in Rural Grove, Montgomery County, son of Garrett and Mary Haggart Dopp and had resided in Dolgeville for 40 years. He was a member of the Universalist Church, which he had served as clerk for 25 years. He also was a member of Dolgeville Lodge 796, F&AM, and the Royal Arcanum of Little Falls.

Mr. Dopp served as mayor of Dolgeville for five years from 1913 to 1918, and always took an active interest in civic affairs and sports. He was an active member of the Civic Club at the time of his death, as he had been of the Agawanda and the Exchange Clubs, its predecessors. He was an exempt member of Spotford Hose Co.

Shortly after he came to Dolgeville he became vicepresident [sic] of the Dolgeville Slipper Co., and served as foreman for that company and its successor for 31 years. He opened his restaurant business here in association with his daughter in 1934.

On Dec. 30, 1901 he married Nellie Dunckel of Dolgeville, who died Aug. 10, 1932.

Surviving are a daughter, Lucy, at home; a brother, Clyde, Gloversville.

A Masonic service will be held from his home at 2 p.m. Wednesday. The Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton, Universalist Church, will officiate. Burial will be in Dolgeville Cemetery.
