Obituary.

Mrs. Mary Anderson, widow of Walter W. Dorman, died at her home east of this village, Oct. 16, 1906. She was born in Herkimer county, Nov. 14, 1839, and came to this county with her parents when quite young. Since her marriage, with the exception of a few years spent in the village, she had always resided on the farm where she died. Mr. Dorman died in Sherman, Dec. 28, 1902. She is survived by one son, Osmer L. Dorman, one daughter, Mrs. Clark Wallace, one sister, Mrs. A. D. Stearns of Silver Creek, and two brothers, M. W. Anderson of Westfield and Dell Anderson of this place.

Deceased had been an invalid for many years, but during the summer had been better and was happy in making plans for the future. [On] September 29, she fell and fractured her hip and although she was hopeful and determined to live, she was not physically able to bear the pain and confinement and failed gradually, until death relieved her.

Mrs. Dorman was in every sense of the word a home-maker. She was devoted to her family, who in return gave her an unusual devotion, and yet she did for others all that she was able. She was a good neighbor and friend, patient in trouble, generous and kind.

The funeral was held Thursday, Oct. 18, at one o'clock, Rev. A. [Albert] R. Fiske of the Universalist church officiating. The burial was in the Sherman cemetery.
