Little Falls Woman Passes Away After Illness of Week
With Tonsillitis and Meningitis

Little Falls, Feb. 5—Mrs. Sarah Louise Haynes Doxtader, wife of William R. Doxtader, passed away Saturday morning at 5:20 a.m. after an illness of only a week. The cause of death was tonsillitis, which developed into spinal meningitis. She was the daughter of the late Nathaniel and Sabria Hall Haynes and was born in Marcy, January 18, 1862. Following her marriage to Mr. Doxtader April 30, 1887, she had resided in this city, where she was known and highly regarded by everyone. Her death coming at this time is a great loss to Mr. Doxtader, as only a few years ago, their only daughter, Mrs. Ernest Scott, died.

The deceased was a devout member of the Universalist Church of this city and a member of the Ladies' Aid Society of that church.

Besides her husband, she is survived by her granddaughter, Eleanor Frances Scott of Herkimer; two sisters, Mrs. Mary Baker of Utica, and Mrs. Hattie Wood of Frankfort; and one brother, Seymour Haynes of Marcy.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 p.m. from her late home, 521 Lansing St., Rev. Seth R. Brooks of the Universalist Church officiating. The remains will be placed in Fairview vault for interment in the spring.
