JACOB DUENCH Death of a Former Resident of Attica and Darien in Batavia

Jacob Duench died from heart disease at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon at his home at Washington and Jefferson avenues. He had been seriously ill since February 24th last.

Mr. Duench was born in the province of Ontario, Canada, on July 18, 1850. He came to Buffalo to live in 1870, but spent most of his life in Attica, where he conducted a blacksmith shop 25 years. He also resided a year in Darien and moved to Batavia two years ago. Since last October he had been conducting a small store at No. 44 Washington avenue. He was a member of the Darien Center Lodge, I.O.O.F.

Besides his wife Mr. Duench is survived by a daughter, Mrs. H. E. Winspear of Batavia, and six brothers, Christian, William, Louis, George, Henry and Stephen Duench, all of Ontario. The funeral will be held at 10 a.m. on Saturday from the house and the interment will be in the Grand View cemetery.
