Mrs. Harriet Dunham

Harriet Muir Dunham, the daughter of James and Beulah Muir, was born on the farm now occupied by Frank Stebbins, August 6, 1826, and died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Sanford Baker, Saturday, December 5, 1914.

In 1842 she [was] married to Larmon Dunham of Utica, and to them were born four children: James H. Dunham, Mrs. Francis Van Slyke, Hazel Dunham and Mrs. Sanford [Jane] Baker.

After living in Utica and Syracuse for a number of years they returned to Earlville, where Mr. Dunham died in March, 1901.

Mrs. Dunham lived alone until six years ago when overtaken by sickness she went to live with her daughter, Mrs. Baker, and had been a helpless invalid for the greater part of the time since.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Francis [Frances] Van Slyke of St. Louis and Mrs. Sanford Baker, together with nine grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held from Foster's undertaking rooms yesterday at 1:30 p.m., Rev. Allison of the Universalist church of Madison officiating.

Burial was made in the Earlville cemetery.
