MRS. ISAAC S. DURFEE Her Death at Her Son's Home in Batavia Yesterday Morning

Mrs. Lydia Durfee, widow of Isaac S. Durfee, died at 7 o'clock yesterday morning at the home of her son, W. Ray Durfee, No. (?9) Tracy avenue, from the infirmities of age. She had been ill since January.

Mrs. Durfee was born in a log house in the southwestern part of the town of Byron, on July 7, 1828, being the daughter of John and Diana Seymour. The family moved to Sangerfield, Madison [now Oneida] county, where in 1849 her marriage to Mr. Durfee took place. Mr. and Mrs. Durfee moved back to the Hulett place in the town of Byron in 1855 and lived there many years. Seventeen years ago Mr. Durfee died and a year later Mrs. Durfee moved to Batavia. She had been residing for the past seven years with her son, who is the only near relative. Mrs. Durfee was a member of the Universalist church.

The funeral will be held at 2 p.m. on Wednesday from the home of Mrs. Durfee's son, the Rev. Harry M. Wright of Lockport, Formerly of Batavia, officiating, and the interment will be in the Grand View Cemetery.
