DEATH OF CARLTON DUTTON

A telegram was received this morning from Buffalo, announcing the sudden death of Carlton Dutton¹. No particulars were given.

Deceased was a native of Vermont, and came to this city more than twenty years ago, and resided here until a year or more since, when he removed to Buffalo. He was employed for several years by the Auburn and Rochester Railroad Company, as a mechanic, and subsequently engaged in the manufacture of car wheels on an extensive scale, in company with E. D. Carpenter, on Water street. He was, however, unsuccessful in the end in that branch of business. In the spring of 1856, he was elected Alderman for the 10th Ward, and served two years in the Board.

Mr. Dutton was a man of genial temper and esteemed by his acquaintances, who were numerous. He was a brother of Carlos and Harry Dutton, of this city; the former well known as a Railroad Superintendent, the latter as a Conductor on the Central Railroad. He was twice married, and leaves a widow [Libbie] and several children.

Deceased was a member of the Masonic order—a Knight Templar—and the fraternity will no doubt, attend his funeral when arrangements are made.
