Mrs. Laura P. Dutton died February 19th. Mrs. Laura Peck Dutton was born in Stockholm, March 18, 1844, and was married August 25, 1861, to Ira Dutton, also of Stockholm. Mr. Dutton was a prosperous farmer and when age crept on they left the farm near Old Forge and came to Winthrop to make their home, where he died.

He was a member of the G. A. R. Post and they were both loyal Grangers. Mrs. Dutton went to her daughters before Thanksgiving to spend the winter and about two weeks ago was taken ill and gradually failed until the end came at 9 p. m., Feb'y 9. The funeral was held at the home of the daughter, Sunday, at 2 p. m., Rev. O. H. Alvord, pastor officiating. Burial was in Winthrop cemetery beside her husband. She leaves four children, Mrs. Lillian Seaver of New York; Delon of Burlingame, Calif.; Willard of Elmhurst, L. I., and Mrs. Lora Packard of Winthrop; one sister, Mrs. Almeda Alexander of Worcester, Mass., and several grandchildren, besides other relatives.

The Masons attended the funeral in a body to represent the son Delon, who was unable to be present.

Mrs. Dutton had been a faithful member of the Universalist church for a number of years and the beautiful flowers bore testimony of the love of her many friends. She will be much missed by all.
