DEATHS.

In Frankfort, on the 16th inst., of a severe scald, received the day previous, [Alexander], the youngest son of John B. Dygert, Esq., aged about 17 months. The agonies of the innocent little sufferer, from the time the accident occurred till he was relieved by death, were such as none could behold—especially the afflicted parents—without the most painful emotions. The funeral services were attended on the 18th.—The reading of Scripture, and prayer in the German language, were performed at the house of mourning by Rev. Mr. Spinner, of Herkimer, and after the burial [in Oak View Cemetery], the procession moved to the New Church, at Frankfort, where the consolations of the gospel were administered, and a sermon, in English, delivered by the Senior Editor [Rev. Dolphus Skinner], from 2d Samuel xiv:14.
