Mrs. Louisa Ellison died at the home of her niece, Mrs. George Poole, in this village last Tuesday night, as the result of the infirmities of old age. Mrs. Ellison was 84 years old. The funeral was held Friday from the home, Rev. E. [Emerson] H. Malone [minister of the Universalist Church] officiating, and burial being made at the Southville cemetery.

Louisa Ayers Ellison was born in West Stockholm and about half a century ago married Otis Ellison. He died 35 years ago [in 1896] at Vancouver, B. C. Mrs. Ellison then lived with her son until his death two years ago when she came to her niece's. She was a delightful, cheerful woman who during her life time had crossed the continent five times.
