Durward B. Everett, 80, of 62 Chedell Place, well known Auburnian, died early Sunday morning in Auburn City Hospital. Born in Macedon in March, 1864, the eldest son of Samuel Hance Everett and Arietta Smith Everett, Durward Everett had made his home in Auburn since 1904.

Upon coming to this city, Mr. Everett was connected with the International Harvester Company for five years. Following his connection with the Harvester Company, Mr. Everett was engaged in the automobile business until 1912. For the past 32 years, he was general agent for the Ontario Drill Company of East Rochester.

Mr. Everett was one of the oldest members of the Auburn Lodge of Elks, having been a member of that organization since 1904.
