MRS. EVERETT, ACTIVE IN D.A.R, DAUBERS, DIES

Mrs. Julia Gallup Everett of 52 Chedell Place, widow of Durward B. Everett, died early Saturday morning at her home. She was born in Macedon, N. Y. and had made her home in Auburn for 44 years. She was a member of the First Universalist Church.

Mrs. Everett was well known in Auburn and had been active in various fields. She was one of the founders of the Cayuga Museum of History and Art, she was a member of the Daubers Club and the Art Research Club, and for 36 years she had been a member of Owasco Chapter of the D. A. R., having joined the Chapter on January 2, 1912. From the start she was active in the work of the D. A. R. and served as regent of the Chapter from 1928 to 1929. She also had held the offices of treasurer and registrar and served several times on the local Board of Management and had been chairman of various committees. Mrs. Everett was deeply interested in genealogy and the general work of the chapter.

Mrs. Everett is survived by two sons, Nathan O. Everett of Louisville, Ky., and Julian G. Everett, Dobbs Ferry, N. Y.; five grandchildren, Alice and Julia O. Everett of Dobbs Ferry, Helen E. and Virginia and David N. Everett of Louisville.

Private services will be held at the convenience of the family on Monday afternoon at the Funeral Chapel of Lester E. Brew, 48 South Street. Rev. Earl N.
