EVERTON

The Rev. Mrs. Eliza Curtis Everton, widow of the Rev. J. [Jasper LeRoy] Everton, passed away May 11, 1934, at the home of her foster daughter, Mrs. T. A. Wayland, in Atlanta, Ga. She was a former resident of Victor, her husband having been pastor of St. Paul's Universalist church. Mrs. Everton was also a Universalist minister, and from the time of her ordination in 189(4?) to the time of her husband's death she gave herself whole-heartedly to the work of the churches which he served as pastor, occupying the pulpit when needed in that capacity. Five years were spent in missionary work in North Carolina.

The Christian Herald expressed a sentiment shared by Victor friends in closing the obituary notice in that publication with the following sentence: "A woman of sweet graces, ability and broad sympathies; she gave good account of her stewardship, enriching the world by her diligence, her integrity and her faithfulness."

The body was returned to Stockton, Ill., the last pastorate of Mr. Everton, who died in 1925. Services were held in the Universalist church there.
