Death of Almon B. Fargo

Mrs. Elvira L. Fargo, widow of Almon B. Fargo, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. G. E. Mepsted, at 5 o'clock Saturday morning.

She has been in failing health for more than eight years, but was confined to the bed only since April 23.

Mrs. Fargo was born in Summerdale, Chautauqua county, June 4 1841, the youngest daughter of Stephen P. and Maria Orcutt Northway, and since her fourteenth year had spent the most of her life in this vicinity, where she had a large circle of friends.

She leaves to mourn her loss her daughter, Ida L. Mepsted, her son Bertrand A. Fargo and her grandson, Harry A. Kimball, all of Clarendon; her granddaughter, Mrs. Laura E. Archer of West Sweden [Monroe County], and seven grandchildren, also her brother Corydon P. Northday of Clarendon.

The funeral, which was attended only by some of her immediate relatives, was held at the home of her daughter, where she had been cared for since February 28 last. Rev. Lewis H. Robinson, minister of the Universalist church of which she has long been a member, conducted the services, and she was laid to rest in beautiful Hillside, Monday afternoon, amid a wealth of beautiful flowers, mute tributes of the love and esteem in which she was held.
