"The sudden death of Mrs. H. M. [Dorothy] Farrington of 63 Thorndale Terrace on Tuesday morning [14 April], coming so soon after the death of the husband [Horace] with whom she had lived so happily for nearly fifty years, was a great shock to her friends, and many are the expressions of sympathy heard for the daughters whose faithful service in our schools and in our church has made them known and loved by a large circle of acquaintances. Another daughter, Mrs. Alfred Mimmack of Buffalo, shares the bereavement.
