Frank P. Ferrin, 95 of Bristol Passes

CANANDAIGUA, Oct. 10—Frank P. Ferrin, 95, one of Ontario County's oldest residents, died today (Oct. 10, 1958) in Thompson Memorial Hospital after a long period of failing health.

Mr. Ferrin was a lifelong resident of the Bristol area. He was a supervisor of the Town of Bristol from 1922-1926, former justice of the peace, and was an assessor for 20 years.

He was a member of the Bristol Universalist Church for 65 years and had served as trustee of the church for 35 years.

He was a farmer during most of his life, owning a 200-acre property in the western section of Bristol near Baptist Hill. His wife, the former Anna Pickard, whom he married in 1886, died in 1955. During the final years of his life he lived with his son, Floyd A. Ferrin. He is survived by his son; a granddaughter, Mrs. Anthony Chivaro, Rochester; two great-granddaughters, and a brother, Lewis Ferrin, Canandaigua.

A service will be held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday in the Bristol Universalist Church with the Rev. Hardy Lumb, pastor, officiating. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery, Bristol. Friends may call at the Kennedy Funeral Chapel in this city, 2-4, 7-9 p.m. Saturday.
