## WINTHROP Death of Mrs. Agnes Buck Folsom on Wednesday, June 23

Mrs. Agnes Buck Folsom died the farm home of her father, Dr. C. H. Buck, on Wednesday, June 23, about 6 o'clock, after a long illness of consumption, aged 38 years and 11 months. The funeral was held Friday afternoon at two o'clock from the Universalist church, Dr. Atwood, from Canton, officiating, assisted by Rev. Saunders. She was a faithful member of the Universalist church. In many ways her services were felt for good, with a desire to encourage and aid those engaged in it, and a rare efficiency in doing what she undertook made her a valuable adviser and helper and one who will be sorely missed and mourned. She was practical and business like in her methods, was not wholly engaged in any one work, but ready with heart and hand for many kinds of service. She spent a winter in California in 1905 and on her return clerked for Folsom & Co., and later for the late Ed. F. Russell until his death occurred. Agnes Bradley Buck and Clayton Folsom were united in marriage the 27 of last July. She was the oldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Buck. The youngest daughter, Mrs. Wesley Sweet, died about one month ago very suddenly and many hearts were saddened by the early and untimely death of the highly esteemed young woman. When the light of this life went out Wednesday evening a second bereavement came upon their father's home. Our sympathies are with these broken homes. For the sisters there is a better and enduring home eternal in the heavens. The funeral was largely attended, the pall bearers being Jerry McCarthy, A. J. Fields, L. E. Ellison and L. H. Packard. Interment in Winthrop cemetery.
