CHARLES M. FOSKETT

Charles M. Foskett of 42 Borden avenue passed away Wednesday, May 13 after an illness of several months of valvular heart trouble. He was able to be around the house and late in the afternoon laid down to rest from which he did not awaken.

He was born in Perry, October 8, 1855 and for many years was a resident of Chicago where he was engaged in the plumbing business. He retired a few years ago and in January, 1920 came to Perry to make his home. He was fond of the great outdoors, fond of music and a good neighbor. In 1911 his first wife, Miss Marcina Tapper of Chicago died and in 1917 he was united in marriage to Mrs. Alice Abrams of Oregon, who survives, together with three sons, Roy M. and Elmer of Chicago and George D., of this place. One brother, C. D. Foskett and one sister, Mrs. Esther Slocum of this place also survive.

Mr. Foskett was a member of the Church of the Redeemer, Universalist, Chicago; a member of F. & A. M. and the Knights Templar.

The funeral was held from the house Saturday afternoon at two o'clock with burial at Perry Center, Rev. W. [William] J. Metz [of the Perry Universalist Church] officiating.
