The funeral of Mrs. Mary F. Foster took place from 1453 Pacific street, the Rev. Charles R. East [Universalist] officiating. After Mr. Foster's death, some twenty years ago, Mrs. Foster and Mrs. John H. Clarence, of Brooklyn; Mrs. J. D. Reed and Mrs. E. E. Marsden, of Boston, and eight grandchildren.
