DEATHS.

In Byron, Genesee county, May 1st, Mr. TALCOTT FOSTER, aged 66 years. Mr. Foster was one of the first settlers in Byron, and was uniformly one of the most industrious and prudent citizens, and a believer in God's impartial grace, until a few weeks before his death, when, in consequence of pecuniary losses by the treachery of a neighbor, he became melancholy, and as is believed, deranged, in which state of mind he committed suicide by hanging. Few men will be more missed in the circle of society in which he moved, than Br. Foster.

The funeral was held in the Free Will Baptist meeting-house, on the 3d inst., by a large congregation who sympathized with the deeply afflicted mourners and friends. Br. N. [Nelson] Sawyer, who delivered the funeral discourse from Rom. viii:18-23, was kindly assisted in the services by Rev. Mr. Danforth (Methodist) and Rev. Mr. Holt (Baptist); and also united in prayers at the grave, for a blessing on the deeply mourning friends of the deceased. May God abundantly comfort them in their afflictions!
