## Fred Fulton Fox

Fred Fulton Fox of 967 Westmoreland av., Syracuse, died at the House of the Good Samaritan, Watertown, about 4 o'clock Thursday afternoon, Nov. 20. He had been ill for about a year and had been a patient at that hospital for seven weeks.

Funeral services were conducted at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Fox, in Douglass street, Mannsville, Monday, Nov. 24 at 2. The officiating clergyman was Rev. F. [Frederick] W. Betts, pastor of the First Universalist Church, Syracuse. Interment was in Maplewood cemetery, Mannsville.

Mr. Fox was born in Mannsville March 6, 1890, son of William H. and Inez Fulton Fox. He attended Mannsville Union School and graduated from Watertown high school in 1907. He graduated from Syracuse University with the B. S. degree in 1912 and was an active member of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity.

While attending Syracuse University the summer vacations were spent at Thousand Island Park where he had charge of the baggage and express on the dock.

After his graduation from the University, Mr. Fox spent two years in Kingston, Pa. In 1915 he began working for the Aetna Life Insurance Company and had charge of their exhibit at Santiago at the Panama-Pacific Exposition. He first began working for that company at Hartford, Conn., but was transferred to Syracuse seven years ago. Later he became connected with Wadsworth and Olmstead, general managers, located in the Chimes building, Syracuse, and was in their employ at the time of his death.

Mr. Fox was married to Miss Bessie Dale Feb. 1, 1917, at Scranton, Pa., by whom he is survived, together with one daughter, Helen, ten years of age, his parents, one sister, Mrs. Lydia Fox Severance of Mannsville and one aunt, Miss Ella Fulton of Watertown.

Mr. Fox was highly esteemed and was a very public-spirited man. He was a member of the Safety Division of the Syracuse Chamber of commerce and was a trustee of the First Universalist Church of Syracuse.
