DEATH OF AN OLD LADY. Mrs. John A. Fox, a Resident of Cuba for Over 62 Years Passes Away at the Advanced Age of 84 Years

Mrs. Fox's death occurred at the home of her daughter, Mrs. S. [Sherman] K. [Antoinette] Ford, just East of this village, Thursday, July 6th, 1899. Cause of death, cirrhosis of the liver. The funeral was held Saturday afternoon at the Universalist church, Rev. Alice Bradley of Friendship officiating. Interment in the Cuba cemetery.

Jennett Hubbell was born in Columbia, Herkimer Co., New York, Dec. 11th, 1814. Lived there until she was 14 years of age, when she moved with her parents to Cuba, Allegany Co., N.Y., in 1828, residing there with her parents until her marriage with John A. Fox, Dec. 25th, 1842. Having taught school in log school houses for 15 terms, she moved with her husband back to Columbia in 1842, residing there until 1850, when she again moved with her husband back to Cuba, and back to Cuba, where she resided until her death, aged 84 years 6 months and 25 days.

She leaves to mourn her loss a husband, one daughter, Mrs. S. K. Ford of Cuba, one brother, Mr. John Hubbell of Cuba, one sister, Mrs. G. I. Barkea of White Hall, N.Y., five grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, and many warm friends.

Deceased was a woman of many sterling qualities and was held in the highest esteem by all who knew her. The sorrowing family have the sympathy of our citizens in their sad bereavement.
