Warren Fox Dies

In the death of Warren Fox, who passed away at his home, 618 East Monroe Street, the city has lost a valuable citizen. Mr. Fox had been ill for nine weeks with an abscess in the ear and was thought to be on the way to recovery, when a few days ago a mastoid developed which hastened his death.

Mr. Fox was born October 2, 1855, at Indian Castle. His father was Hiram Fox, an old settler, who was a descendant of Christopher John Fox, an officer at the battle of Oriskany under General Herkimer. Mr. Fox's early education was in the Danube school, and later he attended the Little Falls Academy. After completing his education he engaged in farming until 1906, when he became a resident of this city.

He was a member of the Little Falls Grange and the O.C.A.M., and a commercial traveler. He attended the Universalist Church. Mr. Fox was a companionable man, of the highest type of citizenship, a staunch friend, a kind-hearted and sunny disposition, and held the regard of a legion of friends.

Mr. Fox was twice married. His first wife was Emma Snyder of Newville. In 1878 he was married to Margaret Seeber, also of Newville. Of this union there was a daughter, Ada Fox, who married Edward Conyne. She died in 1912. Surviving are the widow and one sister, Mrs. Gen. W. Shalt. The funeral will be held from the late home at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Rev. H. [Henry] M. Cary officiating, and interment will be in Church Street Cemetery.
