Final Rites for Mrs. A.O. French

Universalists in the Allegany-Steuben Association will greatly miss Mrs. Alpha O. French of Hunt who always attended the annual meetings, if it were possible for her to make the trip from her home. For two years she had lived generally alone on her farm, located a few miles from the village of Hunt. She was one of the last five surviving members of the church in Portageville and attended the centennial of the society in 1941.

Mrs. Smith [sic] had been in poor health during the past winter, and her death occurred on March 29 in her eighty-ninth year. She was the last of 12 children of a pioneer family. Her marriage to Alpha O. French [as his second wife] occurred in 1921 and his death occurred in 1941. She was a loyal and generous Universalist with particular interest in the State and General Conventions and the Theological School. She was an ardent reader of "The Christian Leader" and the Empire State Universalist.

The Rev. Julia M. Tobey of Perry conducted the funeral services in [her] late home on April 1. She is survived by a step-son, Roy K. French of Attica, two nieces and two grand-nephews.
