JOHN M. FUCHS, 65, DIES AT STAMFORD

John M. Fuchs of 462 Rugby rd., formerly a prominent manufacturer of printing inks, and for many years a well-known resident of the Flatbush section, died suddenly on Monday at Stamford, N.Y. He was 65 years old.

Mr. Fuchs was born in Germany and came to this country at the age of 16. The family settled in the Eastern District, where he came into prominence in the social life of the section, his home being for a long time at 545 Bedford ave., which at the time was one of the most select neighborhoods of old Brooklyn. He was then an enthusiastic member of the Hanover Club and also of the Germania Club of Brooklyn. He took a keen interest in the affairs of All Souls Universalist Church and was formerly a deacon of that church and treasurer of its Men's Club. He was also a member of Hyatt Lodge, F. and A.M.

He was a successful business man, and at the time of his retirement in 1902, was president of the Fuchs & Lang Manufacturing Company of New York, which supplied printing inks to most of the leading publishers.

Mr. Fuchs is survived by his wife, Emily T. Fuchs; four sons, Herman, Edward, John and Fred, and a daughter, Mrs. Arthur Brockway. The funeral services will be held at his home, this evening at 8 o'clock, with the Rev. Arthur C. Church, associate pastor of the Tompkins ave. Congregational Church, officiating. The interment will be in Evergreen Cemetery.
