DEATHS.

In Hume, Allegany county, February 11th, Mrs. AMANDA FULLER, wife of Mr. John Fuller, aged 32 years.

Her parents visited her, from Orleans county, and she visited the connections in that vicinity, in their company. They concluded to return home, but after the sleigh came to the door, they gave up their intention on account of the coldness of the weather. Mr. Fuller then proposed that, as Mrs. Fuller was unwell, she should go with him in the sleigh, to Doctor Pratt's in Cold Creek village. She did so; and on the return home, they stopped a few minutes—he at a store, she in the house of an acquaintance. On starting again Mrs. Fuller got into the sleigh, but the horse being restless, Mr. Fuller was unable to get fairly in before the horse ran away. As he was about to enter the bridge, which is 20 feet above the water of the creek, the sleigh struck a piece of timber put there as a side guard to the entrance of the bridge, and Mrs. Fuller was thrown with great force a distance of about 20 feet, on to the solid ice. She never moved after the fall, and died about three hours afterward.

She was beloved by all who knew her, and of a mild and charitable disposition, a consistent Universalist. Sermon on the 13th, by Br. I. B. [Ichabod Blakeslee] Sharp, assisted in the services by Elder Fuller, of Pike, Baptist.
