DEATH OF MISS GALLUP

Estimable Woman Passed Away Unexpectedly Early This Morning

Saturday, Jan. 14

The death of Miss Mary Eda Gallup occurred this morning at 4 o'clock, at the home of her sister, Mrs. D. B. Everett at 52 Chedell place. Miss Gallup was born October 9, 1872, in Macedon, N.Y. She was the daughter of Silas Nathan Gallup, who was a native of Scipio, this county [Cayuga], and Julia Corser Gallup. Her father was for many years associated with the firm of Bickford & Huffman, grain drill manufacturers of Rochester, and had his family home in Macedon. He was well known as a business man throughout that section.

After his death, Miss Gallup came to Auburn, where she has lived for six years. For most of that time she has suffered from a chronic disease, during which she has exhibited splendid courage and endurance. Her death, although thought to be soon inevitable, was unexpected at this time and comes as a shock to her family and her friends. She had never been confined to her bed and was up only the evening before her death.

There will be a short service at 52 Chedell place at 10 o'clock Monday morning, with the Rev. A.[Arnold] S. Yantis [Universalist] officiating, and at 11 o'clock the funeral party will go by special car on the trolley line to Macedon, where the funeral services will be held in the Universalist church at 2 o'clock. The Rev. Harry Wright of Batavia [also a Universalist] will conduct this service and burial will be made in Macedon.

Miss Gallup's near relatives are her sister, Mrs. D. B. Everett of this city, and her brothers, Wayne Gallup of Rochester and George Nathan Gallup of New Orleans, formerly of Auburn. The latter will arrive here tomorrow morning.

Miss Gallup was a woman whose remarkably fine qualities endeared her to her friends and her sudden death is a great affliction to them.
