DEATH OF JAMES M. GAYLORD A Graduate of Falley Seminary and a Native of Granby

The death of James M. Gaylord, sixty-five, which occurred in Syracuse yesterday, will be held from his late home in Stolp avenue, that city, Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, the Rev. F. [Frederick] W. Betts, pastor of the First Universalist church, officiating.

Mr. Gaylord was a native of Granby, Oswego county, being born there June 16th, 1850. He was educated at the Falley Seminary, Fulton. Later he entered the real estate business in Fulton and was elected president of what then was a village.

Shortly after, he removed with his family to Corona, California, and assisted in the construction of the famous Corona boulevard and was the founder of the Corona National Bank in that place.

Seven years ago he returned to Syracuse and had been engaged in the real estate business there.

Mr. Gaylord was prominent in Masonic circles, being a Thirty-second degree Mason, a member of Hiram Lodge of Fulton, Lake Ontario Chapter, No. 165, R.A.M., Oswego, and the Shriners. Besides his wife, Celia Terpening Gaylord, he leaves three brothers, Willis C., of Lysander, Edwin P., of Rochester, and Frederick W. Gaylord, of Baldwinsville; and one sister, Mrs. Anna Cook, of Baldwinsville. The funeral will be held at the family home at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon, the Rev. F. W. Betts officiating. Burial will be made in Oakwood cemetery.
