Death of Charles George

Charles George, aged 70, died at his home, No. 46 Walnut Street, late yesterday afternoon from internal injuries caused by falling downstairs at his home last Saturday. Mr. George has suffered three serious falls within the last year. In the early part of 1913 he fractured a leg and last Summer was severely injured when he lost his balance and fell over a bannister a distance of 18 feet, on the stairway of the Osborne Works Club. The deceased was born in England and came to this country at an early age and enlisted in the United States navy where he learned the machinist's trade. He was in the employ of International Harvester Company for 35 years and in 1909 was retired on a pension by the company. For the past three years he has been steward of the Osborne Works Club and during his retirement has spent most of his time at the club.

Because of the illness of some of the members of the immediate family the funeral will be private. He is survived by three sons, S. Edgar and Charles T. George of this city, and Alec T. George of St Louis, Mo.; one daughter, Mrs. Jessie Bennett of Oakwood; two brothers, Walter George of this city and James George of England, and two sisters, Mrs. Charles Beck of Auburn and Mrs. William Smith of Washington, D.C.
