On Sunday last at the Universalist church [in Nunda], were held the memorial services of Miss Carrie E. Gilbert, who died on Tuesday last, after a prolonged illness, of consumption. The house was crowded with the many friends of Miss Gilbert, who listened to an impressive discourse by the pastor, Rev. S. T. Aldrich. On the fount rested the offering of Miss Gilbert's graduating class, consisting of a pyramid, some three feet in height, composed of callas, and other beautiful flowers. On one side of the desk was a beautiful floral crown, the offering of the Sunday school, and on the other a cross from the bearers. Miss Gilbert was a young lady of more than ordinary ability and strength of character, and her charming disposition won for her friends wherever she went. She died on her twenty-first birthday.
