Adelbert A. Gillette

Adelbert A. Gillette, one of the oldest commercial travelers in this part of the country, died Sunday at his home, 38 Greenwood place. He was 75 years of age. Born in Wyoming county, "Pop" Gillette, as he was known among traveling men, made Buffalo his home at an early age. In addition to De Molay lodge 498, F. & A. M., Mr. Gillette was for many years interested in the United Commercial Travelers of America, and was instrumental in organizing several councils of that fraternity and was at one time grand chancellor of Buffalo Council 7.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock at Grace Universalist church. Services will be conducted by the De Molay lodge. Members of the Buffalo council, U. C. T. of A., will attend in a body.
