

[Gilmore, Emma Harrington]

Found Dead in Bed at Her Home at 7 O'clock This Morning

Emma Harrington, widow of the late William H. Gilmore, was found dead in bed at her home, 1422 Oneida street, this morning by her daughter, Mrs. W. [Mae] Frear. The room was filled with illuminating gas that flowed from the gas jet attached to the side wall. Dr. Mahady, the Coroner, made an investigation and found that the stop cock turned without any effort and it is highly probable that it could be turned on without realizing the fact.

Mrs. Gilmore was born in this city 63 years ago, the daughter of the late John and Alvira Yale Harrington. Her education was received in the schools of this city. She was married (39?) years ago to William H. Gilmore, a prominent business man of Utica and manager of the Utica Coal Company. Mr. Gilmore died in 1900. The deceased was a member of the Church of the Reconciliation [Universalist] and was very active in the affairs of church and the societies connected with it. She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. W. [Mae] Frear of Utica; one sister, Mrs. W. H. Greenman of Jamesville, Wis., and one grandson, William Gilmore Frear of Utica.
