GERRIT S. GLEN

DEATH IN NEW YORK CITY OF A MAN WELL KNOWN IN ROCHESTER

Gerrit S. Glen, who was well known in Rochester, died on the morning of June 12th, at the Park Avenue hotel, New York city, after an illness of two weeks. He was in his 68th year.<sup>1</sup>

Mr. Glen was born in Montgomery county, N.Y. He was a man of refinement, genial nature, broad in his views and of patriotic sentiment. He had a practical business knowledge and was familiar with affairs. He married very happily, and many church enterprises and benevolent enterprises in New York city received the active assistance of Mr. and Mrs.<sup>2</sup> Glen during their residence of twenty years there. From his early manhood Mr. Glen was a member of the Universalist Church, but he did not limit his gifts and aid to that denomination.

A short service was conducted at the hotel by the hotel chaplain in the presence of a few friends. The remains were taken to Macedon, where Mr. Glen had a summer home. Interment was made at Mount Hope cemetery, this city, last Monday afternoon.
