Funeral services for Miss Jennie D. Gomm, 73, of 1126 Dewey Ave., who served overseas as a nurse in World War I, will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in Hedges Memorial Chapel, 271 University Ave.

She died yesterday (Apr. 24, 1950).

A native of Rochester, she was a graduate of the school of nursing of the old Rochester Homeopathic Hospital, now Genesee Hospital. She was a past commander of Florence Nightingale Post, American Legion, and a member of the Genesee Valley Nurses Association. She retired from nursing about 10 years ago.

During World War I, Miss Gomm went to Plattsburgh Barracks for her initial training. She then was transferred to Camp Travis, San Antonio, Tex., and finally was sent overseas, where she served with Base Hospital 67 in the war zone.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. M. Gertrude Favour and Mrs. Mabel E. Keeler; a brother, William C. Gomm, and a nephew. Burial will be in Mt. Hope Cemetery.
