DEATHS.

In Watertown, on the 13th ult., Widow *Eleanor Goodale*, in the 83d year of her age. Mrs. G. was among the small number of the human race, who arrive at a good old age, in the enjoyment of health, and with an unblemished moral character. "Like a shock of corn cometh in his season," she was gathered to her fathers in "full age." She has left a large family of children, and numerous descendants, who will long cherish the remembrance of her virtues. She was more than forty years a member of a Baptist church, and her connexion with that church was dissolved *solely* because she believed God "is the Saviour of all men." During the two last years of her life, she was a worthy member of the Universalist church in this village, in the communion of which she died in peace. Her funeral was attended at the session of the Black River Association [of Universalists], according to the notice in the minutes of the proceedings of that body.
