JAMES H. GOODNO DIED SUDDENLY

GREENWOOD, N.Y., July 1.—James Harvey Goodno, one of the most prominent and respected residents of Greenwood, died suddenly Friday morning, June 28, from a heart attack while feeding his chickens. He was born in Greenwood 73 years ago and had lived here all his life. He was born March 23, 1873, in the house where he died. He spent his boyhood with his grandparents.

He was a trainman on some of the fast passenger trains on the New York Central Railroad for many years and personally knew and served Henry Ford, John D. Rockefeller, President Calvin Coolidge and President Herbert Hoover and other men famous in industry and in the Government of the United States. He was a director of the First National Bank of Greenwood, a member of Sentinel Lodge F and A.M. of Greenwood and Royal Arch Chapter of Hornell. A member of the former Universalist church of Greenwood and of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen.

He married Gertrude Case of Canandaigua in 1905, who died leaving a daughter, Catherine. In 1921 he married Blanche Redmond who survives with a son, Redmond S. Goodno, recently discharged from service, and a daughter, Mrs. James [Catherine Jane] Hendy Jr.; 3 grandsons, James Hendy in the U.S. Coast Guard, Gene and Patrick and granddaughter, Carole Ann, all of Berwyn, Ill.

The funeral was held from the late home, Monday at 2:30 p.m., Rev. Harold Ross, pastor of Greenwood Methodist church, officiating. Burial was made in Greenwood cemetery.
