Edwards Man, Aged 46, Dies

Edwards—Edward Watson Grant, 46, son of the late Henry J. and Leta Watson Grant, died suddenly of a heart attack at 2:15 p.m. Wednesday at his home. He had been ill with a spinal trouble a year and on May 23 he underwent a major operation at Hepburn hospital, Ogdensburg.

He had been home from the hospital about three weeks and was able to be around. When stricken with the heart attack he was at the barber shop and was taken home immediately by a neighbor and Dr. Adams was called. He lived only a short time and did not regain consciousness.

He was born in Edwards July 6, 1898, and attended schools here and in 1915 was graduated from Edwards High school. He then attended Pratt Institute, graduating in 1919 as a chemical engineer. He accepted a position with the Nestle's Milk Company at Troy, Pa., and worked for three years. He then accepted a position as chemist for the United Dairy company at Lodi, O. On Nov. 1, 1920, he married Margaret Webb, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. George H. Webb at Troy, Pa.

Surviving besides his wife are Vernon, Jr. of the U.S.N.R., at sea, and George Webb, at home.

For the past ten years Mr. Grant had been a chemist of the St. Joseph Lead company at Balmat.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete awaiting the arrival of his son in the navy.

He was a member of the Masonic Order No. 477 and a member of the Edwards Universalist church.
