Mrs. Grace M. Green, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Wellington W. Jackson, died at her home, Aug. 18. She had been ill since April, when she suffered with a severe attack of "grip," from which she did not recover, it finally developing into quick consumption. [On] July 19th she and her husband went to her Uncle Irving J. Sanderson's, of Black Earth, Wisconsin, hoping the change might be beneficial to her health, but she continually failed and they returned to their home, accompanied by her uncle and aunt, Saturday, Aug. 14th, death ensuing the following Wednesday. The remains were brought here Saturday, Aug. 21st, accompanied by her husband, Frank Green, her uncles of Wisconsin, and her cousin, William I. Tabor, of Utica, besides several relatives from Herkimer, where they were interred in the family burial plot, where it had always been her wish to be laid to rest. Besides her husband, she is survived by a brother, Fred W. Jackson, of Buffalo. The services were conducted at the grave by Rev. J. M. Thomas, in the absence of the Universalist pastor, of which church deceased was a member, and was most impressive. The flowers were beautiful even though most of them having been brought from such a distance. Mr. Green will spend a few days at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank B. Smith, after which he will return to his place of business in Chicago, 749 East Irving Park Bullivard [Boulevard].
