DR. GEORGE W. GREENE DIES AT AGE OF 77
Was Widely Known in Auburn Area for Many Years,
Held in High Esteem As Family Physician

Dr. George Walton Greene, for many years one of Auburn's best known physicians and surgeons, died Wednesday evening at Auburn City Hospital. He was 77 years old.

Doctor Greene was born at Sherwood on December 3, 1862. He graduated from the old Emily Howland Select School at Sherwood, and took his degree in medicine in 1887 at New York Medical College. He practiced in Auburn for 41 years before his retirement 12 years ago. For many years he lived and maintained his office at the corner of Fulton and East Genesee Streets, where he became widely known as a general physician and family doctor. Latterly he had made his home at 83 Hamilton Avenue.

Doctor Greene was a member of St. Paul's Lodge, F. & A. M., and of the Sons of St. George. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Bertha Theurer Greene.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon at his home, 83 Hamilton Avenue, with Rev. Hal T. Kearns of First Universalist Church officiating. Burial will be in Fort Hill Cemetery.

Several years ago Doctor Greene fell and broke one of his hips. This accident curtailed his activities considerably but he continued to carry on his practice. He had unusual skill in treating many maladies and was a great favorite as a family physician.

Doctor Greene loved sports, too, particularly boxing and often attended bouts in local arenas.
