—The shadow of death took away one of our most esteemed women, Mrs. Delia Nutting Gregory, aged 47 years, last Tuesday morning, April 5, after an illness of five weeks of heart disease. She had been in failing health for the past two years and had been forced to give up teaching near her home for that reason. Her daughter, Edna, is a student in St. Lawrence University and was with her mother two or three weeks, caring for her up to the time of her death. Mrs. Gregory has been a very patient sufferer and all that loving hands could do was done for her, but to no avail, and death came as a welcome relief. She was a bright pupil and won many honors at Union Academy and St. Lawrence University, from which she graduated. Mrs. Gregory was well liked by everyone who knew her and her death was a great blow to this community where she will be greatly missed. Her son, Kent, who lives at Adams Center, was unable to be present at his mother's funeral on account of being seriously ill with measles. Her funeral was largely attended at the home of her brother, Gerrett Nutting, at Belleville, Thursday at 2 p.m., Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church, Watertown, conducting the funeral service. The floral offerings were many and beautiful, showing the esteem in which she was held. She was laid to rest in Woodside cemetery. She leaves to mourn her death her husband; six children, Kent, Edna, Goodell, Clara, Barbara and Gerrett; three brothers, Mott Nutting, Pitt Nutting and Gerrett Nutting. Our heartfelt sympathy goes out to the bereaved husband and family.
