DANIEL GRIDLEY DIES SUDDENLY
Man Well Known in Business Circles Succumbs at His Home

Daniel W. Gridley of 1103 E. Adams st. died very suddenly at his home about 10:30 this morning. Mr. Gridley had been out of doors sweeping the sidewalk and in less than 10 minutes after returning to the house he collapsed and died almost immediately. Dr. W. C. DuBois was summoned, but it was too late.

Although Mr. Gridley had not been in the best of health for some time he had complained of no serious illness. In the spring he had a slight attack of sickness, but had apparently recovered.

Mr. Gridley was born near Cazenovia, in 1841, coming to Syracuse in 1895. The family came to hold interest in the property known as the Gridley Block, which was named after them. For the last 11 years Mr. Gridley had been president and superintendent of the Fayetteville and Syracuse Railroad and Turnpike Company. He was very well known in this city and was a member of the Masonic Lodge of Fayetteville.

Besides his widow, he leaves four sons, Oliver D., Francis W., Willis T., and Dr. George L. Gridley; five sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Walrath, Mrs. D. D. Palmer, Mrs. Levi E. Swan, Mrs. George Benjamin and Mrs. Owen Duster, and 11 grandchildren.

The funeral will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday at the First Universalist Church. Burial will be at Yates Homestead Cemetery about two and a half miles west of Chittenango.
