MRS. MARION GRIMES DIES.

Mrs. Lucy P. Grimes, widow of Marion Grimes, died yesterday at her home, 190 Madison st., in her 90th year after a long illness. She was born in Rockport, Mass., and came to Brooklyn in 1861. During the Civil War she did much for the soldiers, making comfort bags and other things to make the Boys in Blue happier. During the World War she worked through the Red Cross and in 1918 had completed 25 sweaters, two scarfs [sic], 15 pairs of wristlets, 15 washcloths and 12 eye bandages, all knit with her own hands. She was one of the oldest members of the Universalist Church of Our Father and remained active in its societies until her health failed. Her husband, who died in 1900, was a prominent real estate man of Brooklyn and active in Masonic circles. She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Thomas Burkhard and Miss Jennie F. Grimes; a son, Louis I. Grimes; a sister, Mrs. Rhoda A. Knowlton; three grandsons and seven great-grandchildren. Funeral services will be private, with interment in Rockport, Mass.
