RICHARD GUILLE DIES SUDDENLY

Well Known Dolgeville Resident Passes Away at Age of 81; Funeral Today

DOLGEVILLE—Richard J. Guile, a well known resident of this village, died suddenly Saturday morning at 9:15 in the yard at the rear of his home on North Main street. He arose in the morning and ate a hearty breakfast. Later he went to the barn to get a basket of wood and on his return to the house he was stricken and died instantly. Coroner Sabin of Little Falls, who was called, ascribed death to heart diseases. Mr. Guile was born September 14, 1853, in the Lotville section of Oppenheim and was a son of the late Daniel and Betsy Hagardorn Guile. His early life was spent in Oppenheim, where he at one time conducted a store. Later he drove a stage between Oppenheim Center and Johnstown. Fifty-three years ago last July he came to this village and for six years conducted the stage route between here and Little Falls. In the year that he came here the deceased built the house which remained his home until his death. In later years Mr. Guile was engaged in conducting a brick yard here, in partnership with the late James Gow. He retired some years ago. On May 18, 1879, Mr. Guile was married to Miss Frances Phipps, whose death occurred in November, 1924. His nearest surviving relatives are nieces and nephews. The funeral will be held at the home at 2 this afternoon, Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton of the Universalist church officiating. The remains will be placed in the local cemetery vault.
