MRS. GUNNISON DIES IN BROOKLYN Was Widow of Former St. Lawrence President HOME FORMERLY IN CANTON

Married Dr. Almon Gunnison July 8, 1866— Was Popular With Students of University (By the Associated Press)

New York, Jan. 6—Mrs. Almon Gunnison, widow of Dr. Almon Gunnison, former president of St. Lawrence university, Canton, N.Y., died at her home in Brooklyn today. The funeral will be held Wednesday.

Mrs. Gunnison, before her marriage to Dr. Gunnison, was Miss Ella Everest of Canton. She became acquainted with Dr. Gunnison during the years he spent at the Theological school of St. Lawrence university, and on July 8, 1866, a few days after his graduation, they were married.

Dr. Gunnison's first pastorate was at Bath, Me., where he remained three years. His work was so successful that he was called to All Souls in Brooklyn, and Dr. and Mrs. Gunnison were there 19 years, then removing to Worcester, Mass., where Dr. Gunnison became pastor of the First Universalist Church. They remained there ten years, when Dr. Gunnison accepted the presidency of St. Lawrence.

During the 15 years that Dr. Gunnison remained at the head of the Canton institution, Mrs. Gunnison was very popular with the students. When Dr. Gunnison retired as president of St. Lawrence, he and Mrs. Gunnison made their home at Brooklyn. Dr. Gunnison died June 30, 1917. Mrs. Gunnison is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Guy L. Harrington of Brooklyn, and one son, Frederick Everett Gunnison, president of the Home Trust Company of Brooklyn.
