Mrs. Haas, 75, Succumbs in Ballston Spa

AMSTERDAM—Mrs. Flossie P. Haas, 75, of RD 3, Amsterdam, a former resident of Little Falls, Dolgeville and Ballston Spa, died Saturday in Benedict Memorial Hospital, Ballston Spa, after a long illness.

Born in Stratford and educated in the public schools of Salisbury, Mrs. Haas was married in 1912 to Willard Haas in Middleville. They lived on various farms in the Little Falls area. He died May 3, 1964.
