Oscar C. Hack Dies; Real Estate Broker

Oscar C. Hack, 67, of 16 Beverly Heights, Greece, an independent real estate broker and a former home builder, died unexpectedly yesterday (March 16, 1959).

Mr. Hack apparently died of a hear attack in Durham's Billiard Parlor, 373 Main St. E., the Coroners' Office said. He was pronounced dead at 11:57 a.m. by a Genesee Hospital physician.

He was a member of the Real Estate Board of Rochester for several years.

A native of Rochester, Mr. Hack served in the Army in World War I. He entered the building and home construction business after his discharge and continued until World War II cut off materials. He built homes in Wendhurst Drive, Bakerdale Road, Greece, and Covington Road, Irondequoit, among other places.

Survivors include his wife, Hazel; a sister, Mrs. Edward Galle, Lagrangeville; a brother, Otto, of Rochester; several nieces and nephews.

A memorial service will be held at the First Universalist Church at 2 p.m. Thursday. The Rev. Donald B. F. Hoyt will officiate. Friends may contribute to the Memorial Fund of the First Universalist Church. Burial will be in Mt. Hope Cemetery.
