JAMES E. HADCOCK, PRESIDENT OF UNION

Herkimer—James E. Hadcock, (?) president of Local 60(?), International Alliance of Theatrical and Stage Employees and Motion Picture Operators Union, died Nov. 23, 1956 in his home, 230 No. Washington St., after a long illness.

Starting at the age of 17, he became a projectionist for the Gem Theater, Little Falls. After a two-year stint as projectionist with the Hippodrome Theater, Little Falls, he came to Herkimer and has been projectionist for the Schine Theater here ever since.

He was born Aug. (16?), 1899 in Little Falls, a son of Frank W. and Celestia Shipman Hadcock. He married Clara Bush in 1917 in the Town of Little Falls with the Rev. H. M. Carey [Cary], Universalist pastor, Little Falls, officiating.

He was a member of the Little Falls Universalist Church.

Besides his wife he leaves two sons, George H., Herkimer Town Clerk, and Frank H., both of Herkimer; two daughters, Mrs. Grace Holleran, Herkimer, and Mrs. John DePietro, Atchison, Kan.; a sister, Mrs. Mae (Estey?), Little Falls; 16 grandchildren.

The funeral will be at 2 Monday from the Holleran Funeral Home, the Rev. Leon Simonetti, Little Falls, pastor of the Universalist Church, officiating. Burial will be in Mountain View Memorial Gardens, Town of Herkimer.
